This medicine is suitable for most people but a few people should not use it. If you are in any doubt, talk to your doctor or pharmacist.

No not use this medicine...

 If you have ever had a bad reaction (e.g. rash. swelling of the face and throat, difficulty

breathing) to any of the ingredients. If you have very high blood pressure or severe heart disease.

 If you are taking any other medicines containing paracetamol.

 If you are taking, or have taken in the last two weeks, drugs for depression known as Monoamine Oxidase Inhibitors (MAOIs). For children under 12 years old.

If any of these apply to you, get advice from a doctor or pharmacist without using Non-Drowsy Sinutab.

4 Possible side-effects Non-Drowsy Sinutab can have side-effects, like all medicines, although these don't affect everyone and are usually mild.

A few people have had hallucinations, but this is rare Occasionally people get skin rashes that are

sometimes itchy.

A few men, especially those with prostate problems, may have trouble passing water.

If you experience any of the following, stop

 There have been rare reports of blood disorders in people taking paracetamol, the symptoms of which include unusual tiredness, unexpected
